#### TODAY'S BIBLE READINGS: Genesis 9:8-15; Psalm 25:4-9; 1Peter 3:18-22; Mark 1:12-15.

Mindful of his covenant, the Lord promises never to destroy creation again by flood waters. The waters of baptism bring salvation and forgiveness through the death of Christ. After fasting forty days and being put to the test, Jesus begins his public ministry.

#### This is Annual Appeal Giving Weekend!

This past Wednesday (2/17), Lent began! All Catholics 14 and older are bound by the law of abstinence. All adults are bound by the law of fast up to their 60<sup>th</sup> year. The current canonical discipline of penance: 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast; that is, limited to a single full meal. 2. The other Fridays of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat. 3. The Fridays of the year outside of Lent remain days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance; this may be physical mortification or temperance or acts of religion, charity, or Christian witness.
